# COORDINATED | Gunmen attack international airport, main military base in Bamako, target Kati, Kidal, Gao, Sevare also Blasts, gunfire hit main military camp in Mali

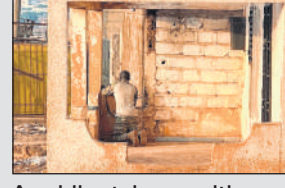
Mali was rocked by a series of coordinated attacks on Saturday as gunmen targeted the capital and other cities in an unprecedented security challenge to the military government. In a statement, the Malian army said unidentified armed forces launched simultaneous strikes against specific locations and military barracks in Bamako.

The most intense fighting in the capital occurred near Modibo Keita International Airport, about 15km from the city centre.

Residents reported hearing sustained heavy weaponry and automatic rifle fire in the morning, while the military deployed helicopters to patrol the surrounding neighbourhoods. The airport is significant as it shares grounds with

a primary air force base. Beyond the capital, the assault appeared to span the country. In Kidal, gunmen reported

ly seized control of neighbourhoods. Mohamed Elmaouloud Ramadane, a spokesperson the Azawad Liberation

Front, said on social media their forces had taken control of key areas in both Kidal and Gao. Although the claims were not independently verified, a former mayor of Kidal confirmed intense gunfire exchanges with the army were ongoing.

Explosions were reported in Kati, a town near Bamako that serves as the headquarters for Mali's main military base and is the residence of General Assimi Goita.

The unrest prompted the US Embassy to issue a security alert on Saturday morning, advising all US citizens to shelter in place and avoid travel to the affected zones until further notice.

Mali, along with neighbours Niger and Burkina Faso, has struggled for more than ten years against insurgencies led by affiliates of Al Qaeda and the Islamic State.

# Palestinians cast vote in historic municipal polls

Electors in Gaza and West Bank head to booths for the first time in years

Palestinians in battle-scarred Gaza voted in local elections on Saturday. In the Israeli-occupied West Bank also, voters exercised their franchise. Local elections have not been held in the West Bank since 2022, while the last poll of any kind in Gaza was two decades ago.

Turnout may reflect public trust in a system led by aging leaders in the West Bank as Gaza prepares for a transition from Hamas rule. The West Bank vote will determine the makeup of councils overseeing water, roads and electricity. The vote in a single city in Gaza is largely symbolic, with officials calling it a pilot.

Though it has not held presidential or legislative elections since 2006, the Palestinian Authority promoted the local races following reforms enacted last year. Under the slogan "We Stay", the Central Election Commission has encouraged participation among 70,000 eligible voters in Deir al-Balah and nearly 15,000,000 in the West Bank.

Most of the electoral lists are aligned with President Mahmoud Abbas's secular-nationalist Fatah party or feature candidates running as independents. There are no lists affiliated with Fatah's arch-rival Hamas, which controls nearly half of the Gaza Strip.

Spokesperson Faraed Taamallah said voting "reflects the will of the Palestinian people to stay on their land". The commission chose Deir al-Balah as it was spared an Israeli ground invasion, despite airstrike damage. "The idea is to link the West Bank and Gaza politically as one system", Taamallah said.

The commission has not coordinated with Israel or

Hamas for the Gaza vote and has been unable to send ballot materials into the enclave. COGAT, the Israeli military body overseeing humanitarian affairs, did not respond to queries regarding election materials.

Average turnout in past local elections has been 50% to

60%. President Abbas, 90, signed a decree last year overhauling the system, allowing voting for individuals and raising quotas for women. However, another decree required candidates to accept the Palestine Liberation Organisation programme, effectively sidelining Hamas.

## B'desh on alert over possible militant attacks

**Dhaka:** Bangladesh Police issued a nationwide security alert over possible militant attacks on key installations, including the parliament complex, officials and media reports said on Saturday.

"The alert has been issued based on intelligence reports," a police headquarters official said, describing the alert as "urgent and confidential".

A PHQ letter warned of possible coordinated attacks targeting the parliament complex, places of worship, entertainment facilities, and military and police installations, with armoured cars as potential targets, Bengali daily Prothom Alo reported.

The Daily Star and other newspapers said the alert was issued after the recent arrest of a banned militant outfit operative, Istiak Ahmed Sami alias Abu Bakkar, who was allegedly in contact with two dismissed military personnel.

The letter included profiles of two alleged key planners behind the potential attacks.

## British jets intercept Russian drones

Two RAF Typhoons have been scrambled from a Romanian air base to engage Russian drones close to Nato airspace, although they did not open fire.

British defence sources said the fighter jets did not enter Ukrainian airspace, contradicting reports that Russian drones had been shot down by the RAF there, an event which would have represented a major escalation in hostilities between the western alliance and Moscow, The Guardian reports.

Romanian officials reported the Typhoons took off at 2am on Saturday in response to the drone threat, established radar contact on the targets and had authorisation to engage if necessary. A shooting down of Russian drones inside Ukraine would be significant as it is not a Nato member and the west has consistently refused to police its skies to avoid a direct confrontation with Russia.

The Typhoons are based in



Romania as part of a rotating multinational Nato air mission to protect eastern European nations from Russian drone incursions that might spill over from the war in Ukraine. RAF Eurofighter Typhoon aircraft operated strictly within Romanian airspace in accordance with the national and allied rules of engagement, officials said, and did not enter Ukrainian airspace at any point.

Meanwhile, at least seven people were killed in Russian strikes across Ukraine overnight, including five in the central city of Dnipro, where officials said an apartment building was hit.

## EU to help with W Asia energy infra to bypass conflict zones

**Nicosia:** A painful fuel crunch and soaring oil and gas prices triggered by the Iran war have nudged the EU to look hard into funding alternative energy routes in West Asia to circumvent hot spots like the Hormuz Strait.

European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said the EU was ready to work with Gulf nations for new projects conveying energy to global markets that wouldn't be held hostage to war or geopolitical strife.

"The events of the past month have taught us a hard lesson," von der Leyen told a news conference at the end of an informal meeting of EU leaders in Nicosia, Cyprus. "Our security is not just

related, it is intrinsically linked. A threat to a merchant vessel in the Strait of Hormuz is a threat to a factory, for example, in Belgium." "We are ready to team up with the Gulf to diversify export infrastructure away from solely the bottleneck of the Hormuz Strait," she said, offering to help repair Gulf energy infrastructure damaged in the war.

Von der Leyen repeated as a result of the oil and gas price hikes, the 27-nation bloc's energy bill in the last 43 days skyrocketed by €25 billion (\$29.3 billion). Neither she nor European Council President Antonio Costa offered precise details on which projects are being considered or when they will

move forward. But von der Leyen referred to the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) between the EU and the world's largest democracy.

Von der Leyen said a summit between the EU and the GCC scheduled for later this year will give both sides the opportunity to explore such projects. Cyprus President Nikos Christodoulides (host), France's Emmanuel Macron, Italy's Giorgio Meloni, Ireland's Micheal Martin, Latvia's Evika Smeeta, Ukraine's Volodymyr Zelenskyy, Egypt's Abdel Fattah el-Sisi, Lebanon's Joseph Aoun, Jordan Crown Prince Hussein bin Abdullah and Syria's Ahmed al-Sharaa also attended the summit. -AP

## US sanctions China refinery over Iran oil

**Washington:** The US on Saturday intensified its campaign against Iran's energy revenues by imposing sanctions on a significant Chinese refinery and dozens of vessels linked to the Iranian oil trade.

The Treasury Department announced that its Office of Foreign Assets Control targeted Hengli Petrochemical (Dalian) Refinery Co Ltd, which it described as a primary buyer of Iranian crude and petroleum products.

"Economic Fury is imposing a financial stranglehold on the Iranian regime, hampering its aggression in West Asia, and helping to curtail its nuclear ambitions," Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent said. The action also targets

nearly 40 shipping firms and vessels associated with Iran's "shadow fleet", which facilitates the transport of oil to global markets. At the direction of Donald Trump, the Treasury aims to constrict the network of intermediaries and buyers Iran relies upon. Treasury officials highlighted China's independent refineries, or "teapots", are the main purchasers of this oil. Hengli, the second-largest such refinery in China, reportedly generated hundreds of millions of dollars for the Iranian military through Sepehr Energy Jahan Nama Pars Company. The US also sanctioned 19 vessels accused of transporting billions of dollars in Iranian crude, LPG and other petrochemicals. -IANS

## Bill for pause on H-1B visas in US Congress

**Washington:** A group of Republican lawmakers has introduced a bill in the US Congress for a three-year pause to the H-1B visa programme, contending it has been hijacked to replace American workers with cheap foreign labour.

Congressman Eli Crane from Arizona introduced the End H-1B Visa Abuse Act of 2026, which was co-sponsored by seven other Republican lawmakers.

The bill proposes reforms to the H-1B programme that include reducing the annual cap from 65,000 to 25,000 with a minimum wage of \$2,00,000 per year and disallowing H-1B visa holders from bringing dependents to the US.

Congressmen Brian Babin, Brandon Gill, Wesley Hunt, Keith Self (all from Texas), Andy Ogles (Tennessee), Paul Gosar (Arizona) and Tom McClintock (California) have signed on as original cosponsors of the bill. The H-1B visa programme is used extensively by American tech firms to employ foreign workers. Indian professionals, including techies and physicians, form one of the largest groups of H-1B visa holders.

The bill seeks changes to the H-1B programme that

include replacing the lottery system with a wage-based selection system; requiring employers to certify they cannot find a qualified American worker and have not conducted layoffs; barring H-1B workers from holding multiple jobs; and prohibiting third-party staffing agencies from employing them.

The bill also seeks to prohibit federal agencies from sponsoring or employing nonimmigrant workers; end Optional Practical Training (OPT); and ensure nonimmigrant visas remain temporary by prohibiting H-1B holders from adjusting status to permanent residency. The changes suggested also require nonimmigrants to depart the US before changing to another nonimmigrant status.

"The federal govt should work for hardworking citizens, not the profit margins of massive corporations. We owe it to the American people to prevent the broken H-1B system from boxing them out of jobs they are qualified to perform," Crane said, adding, the End H-1B Visa Abuse Act of 2026 would provide greater access to employment, strengthen protocols in the visa process, and prioritise livelihoods of Americans. -PTI

## ALTMAN SORRY

OpenAI head Sam Altman has apologised for the firm's failure to alert law enforcement about the online behaviour of a suspect who later killed 8 people in British Columbia. In a letter, Altman expressed "deepest condolences" to the community of Tumbler Ridge following the massacre. On Feb 10, Jesse Van Roostelaar, 18, killed her mother and stepbrother, 11, before fatally shooting five kids and a teacher at Tumbler Ridge Secondary School.

## Pirates hijack oil tanker off Somalia

**Mogadishu:** Suspected Somali pirates hijacked a fuel tanker off the northeastern coast of Somalia, according to an official and the British military. The vessel was seized on Wednesday in waters between the coastal towns of Hafun and Bandarbeyla in the semi-autonomous state of Puntland along the Indian Ocean.

The tanker had departed from the port of Berbera and was heading to Mogadishu when it was intercepted, a colonel with the Puntland Maritime Police Force said. The official said six armed men from Bandarbeyla carried out the hijacking. -AP

The British military's United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations also issued a statement reporting a hijacking incident off the Somali coast. According to the BBC, an additional five armed individuals later boarded the vessel, which has since been moved to an anchorage between Hafun and Bandarbeyla. The ship, which is being held with 17 crew members of Pakistani, Indonesian, Indian, Sri Lankan, and Myanmar nationalities, was carrying a large shipment of fuel. The cargo has become a valuable prize due to petrol prices in Mogadishu tripling. -AP

CCRT is implementing Cultural Talent Search Scholarship Scheme to provide facilities to outstanding talented children selected in the age group of 10 to 14 years (as per the cut off eligibility dates), studying either in recognized schools or belonging to families practicing traditional performing arts for getting specialized training in various cultural fields such as traditional forms of music, dance, drama, painting, sculpture, crafts and literary arts, laying special emphasis on rare art forms, which are in the process of becoming extinct. The scholarship awarded under the scheme is for two years at a time which is renewable after every two years till the completion of the first university degree stage of education or up to the age of 20 years, whichever is earlier, subject to awardees maintaining satisfactory progress.
